Salma believes that women's empowerment is rooted in having the power to dream big and achieve goals that once seemed impossible. This type of courage and tenacity was modeled by her mother, who, as a teenager, left her small town in Mexico and came to the U.S. alone.

"Her stories are a reminder of her strength and the strength that she's passed down to me," said Salma.

Salma was a passionate, dedicated student at ETHS. She also looked for ways to give back, including spearheading a fundraiser for scholarships for DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) students.

The depth of her strength was further revealed after she survived being kidnapped by a former boyfriend. Because of this traumatic experience, she suffered from PTSD. She received counseling at YWCA Evanston/North Shore after being referred here by local law enforcement.

Today, Salma, who is the first in her family to attend college, is studying criminal justice and hopes to become a lawyer. "What I went through helped lead me to this decision. It helped me discover what I want to do with my life," she said. "It also showed me that, like my mom, I can do whatever I want to do. I feel empowered."
